## Training Requirements

You will be considered a Trained Leader when you complete the following:

### Youth Protection Training (ALL Leaders)

#### Cub Scouts

- Leader Specific (Den, Cubmaster, Committee)

#### Boy Scouts

- Leader Specific (Scoutmaster, Committee)
- Scoutmasters also need IOLS (Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills)

#### Venture Scouts

- Venture Advisor Specific
- Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills

#### Sea Scouts

- Venture Advisor Specific
- Sea Scout Adult Leader Basic

Once completed, take your cards or online certificates to the Scout Shop to purchase your "Trained" patch.

## New Youth Protection (YPT2) Changes

As of January 1, 2018...ALL LEADERS must retake YPT Training before Oct. 1, 2018, no matter when last taken. However, if you took after March 1, 2018 you will not have to retake come October 1<sup>st</sup>.

As of September 1, 2017...Council Registrars no longer has the ability to re-charter units that are not YPT compliant before their due date.

Effective June 1, 2018...Adults accompanying a Scouting unit who are present at the activity for 72 total hours or more must be registered as a leader, including completion of a criminal background check and Youth Protection Training. The 72 hours need not be consecutive.

## New Training Requirements

Effective April 30, 2018...NEW direct contact leaders must complete Hazardous Weather Training to be considered position trained.

Required training for all Erie Shores Training Event Coordinators and Wood Badge, NYLT & Summer Camp Staff. This course is intended to "train the trainer" on behaviors and resources while offering hands-on experience in methods and media. (8 hrs.)

University of Scouting.....Nov. 3, 2018

### Leave No Trace (LNT) Awareness

This course will introduce you to the principles of Leave No Trace. We will teach you the LNT principals and how to apply them to the BSA Outdoor Ethics Program. (3 ½ hrs)

### Leave No Trace (LNT) Trainer

Weekend long course that introduces participants to the principals of Leave No Trace and how to apply them and teach them to others. All participants must be at least 14 years old. (2 Day, Overnight)

### University of Scouting

Informative (and FUN) day of required, supplemental and advanced training for adult & youth leaders involved with Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Sea Scouts and Venturing programs.

### Scouter

Award can be earned with 2 yrs. service as a registered Boy Scout Leader. (Form 511-058, 2012 Printing)

### Venturing

Award can be earned with 2 yrs. service as a registered Venture Crew Leader. (Form 511-060, 2012 Printing)

### Sea Scout

Award can be earned with 2 yrs. service as a registered Sea Scout Adult. (No Form No. or Date)

### Scoutmaster Key

Award can be earned with 3 yrs. service as a registered Boy Scout Scoutmaster. (Form 511-054, 2012 Printing)

### Advisor Key

Award can be earned with 3 yrs. service as a registered Venture Crew Advisor. (Form 511-056, 2012 Printing)

### Skipper Key

Award can be earned with 3 yrs. service as a registered Sea Scout Skipper. (No Form No. or Date)

## Family Scouting & Training

Beginning August 1, 2018 Erie Shores Council will begin registering girls in Cub Scouting and with it the start of ESC Family Scout program.

As a leader you may be wondering how this might affect you as a leader...but probably not much. Girls will be required to complete the same requirements as the boys.

As far as training goes...Youth Protection training has changed as previously noted. We have been told that National is in the process of revising the current training to include girls in scouting. At this time we are not sure what those revisions will entail, but believe the changes should be minimal. Stay tuned as more details are released.

## Family Scouting FAQ

### Q. Why is the BSA recommending single-gender units instead of a co-ed model?

The leadership of the BSA determined that the best way to welcome girls to serve today's families was to offer a unique model that builds on the proven benefits of our single-gender program, while also providing character and leadership opportunities for both boys and girls.

### Q. Is this change a result of the BSA's declining membership numbers?

No. The BSA has experienced renewed interest in Scouting, and we believe that is largely in response to program innovation and a more thorough understanding of what families want and need when it comes to extracurricular activities. In fact, recent surveys of parents not involved with Scouting showed high interest in getting their daughters signed up for programs like Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts, with 90 percent expressing interest in a program like Cub Scouts and 87 percent expressing interest in a program like Boy Scouts. Following an evaluation of what families and young people want and need when it comes to extracurricular activities and Scouting, the BSA welcomes girls into expanded programs from Cub Scouts to the highest rank of Eagle Scout.

### Q. Is this change a departure from the BSA's core mission and values?

No. In fact, this aligns with our mission and values. After all, the values of Scouting as detailed in the 12 points of the Scout Law – trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean and reverent – are relevant and important for both young men and women. Our mission is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Scout Law.

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### Q. Are BSA programs relevant for girls?

Yes. On average, more than 90 percent of Scouting families and leaders believe the BSA programs are relevant to both boys and girls. What's more, education experts also evaluated the curriculum and content and confirmed the relevance of the program for young women.
