Training Requirements

You will be considered a Trained Leader when you complete the following:

Youth Protection Training (ALL Leaders)

Cub Scouts

- Leader Specific (Den, Cubmaster, Committee)
- Den Leader & Cubmasters also need Hazardous Weather (online only)

Scouts BSA

- Leader Specific (Scoutmaster, Committee)
- Scoutmasters also need IOLS (Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills) & Hazardous Weather (online only)

Venturing

- Leader Specific (Advisor, Committee)
- Advisors also need IOLS (Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills) & Hazardous Weather (online only)

Once completed, take your cards or online certificates to the Scout Shop to purchase your "Trained" patch.

Youth Protection FAQs

As of June 1, 2018, adults accompanying a Scouting unit who are present at the activity for 72 total hours or more must be registered as a leader, including completion of a criminal background check and Youth Protection Training. The 72 hours need not be consecutive.

As of March 29, 2018, BSA requires two-deep leadership on all outings. A minimum of two registered adult leaders—or one registered leader and a participating Scout's parent or another adult—is required for all trips and outings. One of these adults must be at least 21 years of age. Male and female adult leaders must be present for all overnight coed Scouting trips and outings, even those including parent and child. The adult leaders must be 21 years of age or older, and one must be a registered member of the BSA.

Required training for all adult trainers that wish to assist Council with Youth Protection training.

Train the Trainer

Trainers EDGE **Apr. 27, 2019**
Required training for all Erie Shores Training Event Coordinators and Wood Badge, NYLT & Summer Camp Staff. This course is intended to "train the trainer" on behaviors and resources while offering hands-on

experience in methods and media. Fundamentals of Training is not a prerequisite. (8 hrs.)

Other Training

Leave No Trace-Awareness.....May 18, 2019

This course will introduce you to the principles of Leave No Trace. We will teach you the LNT principals and how to apply them to the BSA Outdoor Ethics Program. (3 ½ hrs)

Adult Training Awards

Adult leaders should always lead by example. If the boys are encouraged to advance, why not the leaders. As an Adult Leader you can earn the following awards.

Den Leader

Award can be earned for Tiger, Wolf, Bear and Webelos.

Cub Scouting

Award can be earned with 2 yrs. service as a registered Cub Scout Leader.

Cubmaster Key

Award can be earned with 3 yrs. Service as a Cubmaster.

Scouter

Award can be earned with 2 yrs. service as a registered Boy Scout Leader.

Venturing

Award can be earned with 2 yrs. service as a registered Venture Crew Leader.

Scoutmaster Key

Award can be earned with 3 yrs. service as a registered Boy Scout Scoutmaster.

Advisor Key

Award can be earned with 3 yrs. service as a registered Venture Crew Advisor.

Unit Leader Award of Merit

Award can be earned with 1 ½ years as a registered Cubmaster, Scoutmaster or Venturing Advisor for dedicated service and responsible leadership, and for providing an opportunity for young people to grow.
