

I AM A NEW DEN LEADER . . . NOW WHAT?

What Happens after I Submit My Application?

Now that you are registered as a Cub Scout den leader, you will begin receiving the monthly **Scouting** magazine, which includes information to assist you as a leader.

Ask your Cubmaster to furnish you a copy of the current "Leader Guide" & "Den Leader Guide" for your Cub Rank. Begin reviewing both Guides as soon as possible.

What Should I Do First?

Since you must complete Youth Protection Training prior to submitting your application, chances are you have already created an account at My.Scouting.org. If not go to website and create an account and complete the "Fast Start" training. This is not required, but will help you get started until you complete in-person or online "Den Leader" training.

What Training do I Need?

A trained leader is better prepared to make the Scouting program all it can be! To be considered "Trained", New Leaders will need to complete the following trainings:

- ✓ Youth Protection (Valid for Two Years)
- ✓ Position Specific Training (Valid for Lion, Tiger, Wolf, Bear, Webelos & Arrow of Light)

All training is available online at My.Scouting.org. For in-person training, register on the Erie Shores Council website at www.erieshorescouncil.org/training or at the Scout Shop located inside the Jadel Leadership Center at the historic Camp Miakonda.

Erie Shores Council recommends in-person training if at all possible. Keep in mind there are pros and cons to both types of training.

In-Person:

- Pro: Allows New Leaders to ask questions and interact with other Leaders.
- Con: Training may not be offered on a date that works with your work and personal schedule.

Online:

- Pro: Can be completed on your schedule, 24/7.
- Con: Cannot ask questions and actually takes longer to complete.

Have the Cubmaster introduce you to the "Pack Trainer" so they can provide you with training information. (Not all Packs have a "Pack Trainer")

What Do I Need to Plan?

Plan your first month's den meetings. This is much easier with the help of the pack trainer, assistant den leader, den chief (an older Boy Scout or Venturer), and the Leader Guides. Meeting plans are ready and waiting for your use in the "Den Leader Guide" for your Cub Rank. You can use these meeting plans as-is or tailor them to fit your needs. The key to success is "KISMIF" (Keep It Simple, Make It FUN.)

What Do I Need to Know About my Den?

Hold a family orientation meeting. Get acquainted with the parents as well as the Scouts. The parents will be a great source of help when needed. Establish a den code of conduct so the Scouts/Parents know what is expected of them. See the Cub Scout Leader Book for details.

What Do I Need to Purchase?

Obtain and begin wearing the Cub Scout leader uniform shirt as soon as possible. It is comfortable and suitable for all Cub Scout meetings and activities. Wearing the uniform properly is important in setting a good example for the Scouts. You will need the following:

- Class "A" Uniform Shirt
- World Crest emblem

- Blue Shoulder epaulets.

What is a Den Chief? Do I Need One?

A Den Chief is a Boy Scout who helps the Den Leader conduct Den Meetings. Den Chiefs are not required, but are highly recommended. He acts as a role model to the younger Scouts, encouraging them to become Boy Scouts themselves, thus becoming a positive link between the Den and the Troop. The role of Den Chief also benefits the Boy Scout as it counts as a leadership position for their rank advancement. Contact the Scoutmaster of the Troop the Pack is associated with, or any nearby Troop to acquire a Den Chief.
