Training Requirements

You will be considered a Trained Leader when you complete the following:

Youth Protection Training (ALL Leaders)

Cub Scouts

- Leader Specific (Den, Cubmaster, Committee)
- Den Leaders & Cubmasters also need Hazardous Weather (online only)

Scouts BSA

- Leader Specific (Scoutmaster, Committee)
- Scoutmasters also need IOLS (Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills) & Hazardous Weather (online only)

Venturing

- Leader Specific (Advisor, Committee)
- Advisors also need IOLS (Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills) & Hazardous Weather (online only)

Once completed, take your cards or online certificates to the Scout Shop to purchase your "Trained" patch.

Why Be a Trained Leader...

I recently attended a local training event where the importance of being a trained leader was discussed. One of the training team told us of a discussion she had with her youngest son recently...

This leader was having a particularly rough week and her son asked what was wrong. She responded that she was becoming frustrated with leaders complaining their time was limited and they did not have the time to attend all the required training. Her son responded, "Why Mom...am I not worth the time?"

This is why you should be a trained leader. Make your scouts feel that they are worth it!

CHANGES IN TRAINING FOR ESC

NEW BSA Training Portal

National has done away with their previous Oracle based training website and replaced it with one specially designed for the BSA. It is less clunky and easier to navigate.

You will access it through your My.Scouting.org account. Home page will include a header showing

what training has been "assigned" to you per your registered position(s). Keep in mind this header only tracks what you complete online & nothing you completed in-person. See My.Scouting.org for all trainings completed or still needed to be considered trained in your position(s)

Training -General

Youth Protection – ONLINE ONLY

REQUIRED training for all registered leaders. This training is designed to help you keep our youth safe from abuse. This training must be completed before submitting any adult leader application.

Youth Protection Facilitator – ONLINE ONLY

Required training for all adult trainers that wish to assist Council with Youth Protection training. Facilitators are required to complete all YPT modules, including the "Optional" module as well. After completion email your certificates to ESC Registrar, Karen Krieger.

Train the Trainer

Fundamentals of Training ... Nov. 7, 2020 @ U of S

Required training for ALL Erie Shores Training Volunteers, unless currently EDGE, Wood Badge Staff or Master Educator trained. Training is intended for both youth and adult trainers. This session is designed to introduce new Scouting trainers to teaching techniques and skills. (4 hrs.)

Trainers EDGE April 24, 2021

Required training for all Erie Shores Training Event Coordinators and Wood Badge, NYLT & Summer Camp Staff. This course is intended to "train the trainer" on behaviors and resources while offering hands-on experience in methods and media. (8 hrs.)

Other Training

University of Scouting November 7, 2020

Informative (and FUN) day of required, supplemental and advanced training for adult & youth leaders involved with Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts and Venturing programs.

Wilderness First Aid (WFA)..... T.B.D.

Course for everyone planning a remote high adventure ranging from lay responders to medical professionals. It focuses on prevention, assessment, and treatment for an ill or injured person in a remote environment where definitive

care by a physician and/or rapid transport is not readily available.

Wood BadgeT.B.D.
An advanced, national leadership course open only to Scouting volunteers and professionals with the purpose to develop skilled leaders who can strengthen Scouting units in achieving the mission of the Boy Scouts of America.

Adult Training Awards

Adult leaders should always lead by example. If the boys are encouraged to advance, why not the leaders. As an Adult Leader you can earn the following awards.

Den Leader

Award can be earned for Lion, Tiger, Wolf, Bear and Webelos.

Scouter's

Award can be earned with 2 yrs. service as a registered Cub Scout Leader, BSA Scouts Leader & District Leader.

Venturing

Award can be earned with 2 yrs. service as a registered Venture Crew Leader.

Cubmaster Key

Award can be earned with 3 yrs. Service as a Cubmaster.

Scoutmaster Key

Award can be earned with 3 yrs. service as a registered Boy Scout Scoutmaster.

Advisor Key

Award can be earned with 3 yrs. service as a registered Venture Crew Advisor.

District Committee Key

Award can be earned with 5 yrs. service as a registered member of a District Committee.

Unit Leader Award of Merit

Award can be earned with 1 ½ years as a registered Cubmaster, Scoutmaster or Venturing Advisor for dedicated service and responsible leadership, and for providing an opportunity for young people to grow.

Protect Yourself Rules Adventures

The Boy Scouts of America is committed to creating safe environments for Scouts and leaders. Child abuse is an uncomfortable topic but an important one for us to cover to ensure the safety and well-being of our Scouts. The Boy Scouts of America has partnered with subject-matter experts from the Barbara Sinatra Children's Center Foundation to present the "Protect Yourself Rules" that help children recognize, respond to, and report abuse.

The Protect Yourself Rules Preview Adventures may be used as an elective adventure OR they may be earned in place of the Cyber Chip requirement for the Tiger, Wolf, Bear, Webelos, and Arrow of Light badges of rank. If used in place of the Cyber Chip requirement for a rank, it may not be used as an elective adventure for that rank. 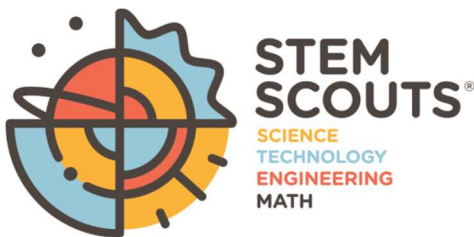

What is Venturing...

You love exploring your passions, making new friends, and discovering the world. You're always looking for an adventure. Rappelling a cliff. Perfecting your shot. Designing a robot. Kayaking into the sunset. Exploring your faith. Volunteering at an animal shelter. The choice is yours! Each activity provides an opportunity to shine and learn more about yourself and the world around you. Venturing is youth-led and youth-inspired.

How will you lead the adventure?

The Venturing program aims to enable young adults to:

- Experience a program that is fun and full of challenge and adventure.
- Acquire skills in the area of their crew's specialty.
- Become a skilled training and program resource for other youth groups.
- Experience positive leadership from adult and youth leaders and be given opportunities to take on leadership roles.
- Learn to make ethical choices throughout their lives by instilling the values of the Scout Oath and Law.
- Have a chance to learn and grow in a supportive, caring, and fun environment.

The Venturing program emphasizes four main areas known as the A-L-P-S model:

- **Adventure** – Mentoring, leading, and participating in crew-led adventures.
- **Leadership** – Ongoing leadership development through training, mentoring, and hands-on leadership.
- **Personal Growth** – Goal-setting in support of personal growth.
- **Service** – Leading and participating in community service.
