# Recharter Time!

Important news for all unit leaders – it's recharter time! The first step to ensure your unit is prepared for the fun, life-changing experiences that will happen in 2020 is the rechartering process.

**NEW** – All recharter packets will be sent to the Unit Key 3 via email. Printed packets are available upon request.

The online charter renewal process will be available **December 1, 2019**. All January charters must be completed and turned into Council Registrar, Karen Krieger, by **January 15, 2020**.

Recharter fees can be paid online with a credit card. A small processing fee will apply.

## Youth Protection Training

Youth protection training is required for all adults. If training is not current, the unit will not be allowed to process its charter with those adults. Registered adults will receive notification that their YPT is expired or about to expire before charter renewal.

## Background Re-checks

New this year, all registered adults must sign the "Additional Disclosures & Background Check Authorization" and submit it with the charter. If the authorization is not

submitted, the unit will not be allowed to process its charter with those adults. Please see [www.erieshorescouncil.org/criminalbackground](http://www.erieshorescouncil.org/criminalbackground) for more information.

## Journey to Excellence (JTE)

In addition to rechartering comes our annual self-evaluation, the Journey to Excellence (JTE).

JTE is a time to look back on how we served our Scouts in the previous twelve months and see where we can improve. The 2019 scorecards are due in to Karen Krieger's office by **December 15, 2019**. The 2020 score cards are available now. Make sure your unit is using this valuable tool.

Part of the JTE score is recorded service hours. PLEASE remember to log your unit's hours on the service hours website or through Scoutbook.

## National Membership Fee Increase

For more than 100 years, Scouting has helped build future leaders by combining educational activities and lifelong values with fun and adventure in the outdoors.

Here in Erie Shores Council, Scouting serves more than 5,000 youth in 4 counties. Now as we continue the Scouting mission, it is important that we keep pace with an ever-changing world. While costs to the organization have increased every year, the Boy Scouts of America has worked to keep the annual membership fee as low as possible by subsidizing core costs, including liability insurance we must carry to cover all official Scouting activities. Unfortunately, it is no longer possible to subsidize at the level we have in the past, especially as the cost of insurance has increased dramatically.

To ensure we have the resources to fulfill the promise of Scouting despite increasing operating costs, the National Executive Board of the Boy Scouts of America has made the difficult but necessary decision to increase the annual membership fee effective **January 1, 2020** to:

- \$60 for youth members in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, and Venturing
- \$36 for youth members in Exploring, and
- \$36 for adult members
- \$60 for unit charters

This amount goes directly to the National BSA and does not include any additional fees a unit may collect. Thank you for your continued role in empowering a generation of future leaders of character through Scouting programs. ## BSA Safety Moment: Hazard Trees

According to the U.S. Forest Service, our nation's forests are experiencing declining health conditions. This has led to the creation of abnormally high numbers of "hazard trees." Hazard trees include dead trees, live trees with dead parts, and live trees that are unstable due to defects and are within striking distance of people or property.

Here are some tips to prevent a hazard tree from affecting your event:

- Assess your site
- Avoid campsites with hazard trees
- Avoid the fall radius of hazard trees
- Don't use hazardous trees as a support
- Check the environment for changes
- Communicate hazardous trees to others
- Do not climb trees

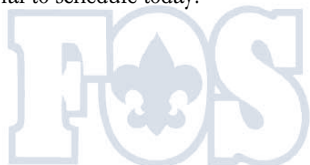

### WPA Projects for Camp Miakonda

During the Great Depression (1933-1936), Camp Miakonda received an estimated \$500,000 of federal government Works Progress Administration (WPA) projects.

Camp Miakonda is the only known Scout camp in the nation to have received such massive government funding during those years.

Two of those WPA projects are still standing: Council Lodge and the camp warehouse. Check them out on your next visit to camp!
