September is Suicide Prevention Month and on September 12, 2022, Erie Shores Council will launch our **Suicide Prevention Award** that can be earned by an adult or Scout in 5th grade and older.

The Council has trained over 100 adult leaders in QPR (Question, Persuade, and Report). This one-hour training on Zoom is very informative and it will equip you to act if you come across a situation where a youth is considering harming themselves.

For our Scouts (5th grade and older) we will begin teaching Mental Wellness Training. A parent or guardian must complete the consent agreement before a Scout with a parent/guardian participates in the training and send it to Erie.ShoresCouncil@Scouting.org.

2022 BSA National Membership Fee Increase

The BSA has released new membership fees that took effect on **August 1, 2022**.

- **\$75** for Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, and Venturing Participants
- **\$45** for Exploring Participants
- **\$45** for all Adult Volunteers (includes the cost of background check)
- **\$100** for a Unit Charter/Affiliation Fee
- **\$25** One-Time Joining Fee for new program participants in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA, and Venturing (Not pro-rated)
- **\$15** for Scout Life Magazine Subscription

The National membership fee helps cover the cost of essential services, including program resources, liability insurance for those participating in approved Scouting activities, criminal background checks, youth protection, and the development of intellectual property.

This amount goes directly to the National BSA and does not include any additional fees a Unit may collect. Erie Shores Council does not charge any additional fees.

Get Ready to “#AdventureOn” with Scouting!

Now is the time to encourage your Scouts to invite a friend to your Unit’s Enrollment Night (formerly Join Scouting Night or JSN). All Units should plan to host a minimum of two Enrollment Nights in the schools and communities they serve to allow the youth multiple opportunities to join Scouting before the end of September. Enrollment Nights should be held at your local elementary school to make it easier for parents to attend.

Examples of materials available include but are not limited to flyers, posters, yard signs, onboarding envelopes, applications, and Adventure Packs (Cub Scout specific). BSA Safety Moment: Fire Safety with Backpacking Stoves

Stoves made for the outdoors can extend the range of your travels by giving you a reliable way to safely cook anywhere and in any weather. Typically, backpacking stoves use white gas, kerosene, propane, butane, or isobutane gas as fuel. Ultralight trekkers also favor alcohol stoves.

Here are some fire safety tips for the proper use of these types of stoves:

- Review the manufacturer's instructions for its proper use, the type of fuel, and how to safely light it.
- Never use large pots as a windscreen for your backpacking stove, because it could lead to an explosion.
- BSA policy prohibits the use of homemade backpacking or alcohol stoves.

- Unleaded gasoline and liquid alcohol fuels are not recommended for use.
- When transporting fuel, use the manufacturer's recommended containers.
- In case of burns, make sure your first-aid kit is well kept, and know your local emergency response contacts and/or locations.
