It's Recharter Time!

First Step

The first step to ensure your Unit is prepared for the fun, life-changing experiences that will happen in 2023 is the rechartering process. Not much has changed since last year, so it will be familiar to our returning Unit Key 3 leaders.

Recharter Packets

Paper recharter packets with all the necessary information will be distributed within the next month through your Roundtables or District Key 3.

Rechartering Resources Hub

Internet Advancement 2.0

The Unit's Key 3 will begin the recharter process online with the online recharter tool found at <https://advancement.scouting.org>.

January Charters

All January charters must be completed and turned in to Council Registrar, Michael Smith, by **January 13, 2023**. Recharter fees can be paid online with a credit card, (a small processing fee will apply) or ACH (bank checking transfer). Payments are also accepted at the Iott Scout Shop.

Journey to Excellence (JTE)

In addition to rechartering comes our annual self-evaluation, the Journey to Excellence (JTE). The JTE standards are now written as activities that the unit will do. This helps to emphasize that JTE is primarily a planning tool.

Make sure your unit is using this valuable tool to provide the best possible program to the youth we serve. It helps you, the Units, and the Commissioner team know where to use our resources. Your District and Unit Commissioner is eager to help with this process.

The 2022 JTE scorecards are due to Council by **December 16, 2022**. Visit www.erieshorescouncil.org/JTE for current scorecards.

Every Scout Deserves a Trained Leader

Youth Protection Training is required for all adults. If training is not current, the unit will not be allowed to process its charter with those adults. Registered adults will receive notification that their YPT is expired or about to expire before charter renewal. Please take this training, it will benefit both you and our youth.

A **Position Trained Leader** is knowledgeable and more confident in the role being performed. Trained leaders impact the quality of programs, youth tenure, safety, and advancement opportunities for our youth.

A simple team structure would be:

- **New Member Coordinator** – This individual will welcome new Scouts and families; help develop Unit membership plans and collaborate with districts.
- **Marketing** – Responsible for promoting the effort through email, social media, geofencing, flyers, and word-of-mouth.
- **BeAScout Chair** – Ensures that the Unit's BeAScout enrollment details are up to date and will respond to queries from interested parents. BeAScout.org is an online referral tool that allows families to find Units in their area – if interested, they can inquire about joining directly online and can even enroll! It's a proven and effective way to enroll families in a connected and socially distanced world.
- **Unit Commissioner** – Your Commissioner is there to help identify needed tools and resources, so don't hesitate to ask for guidance.

BSA Safety Moment: Bunk Beds

On average, 36,000 injuries related to bunk beds occur in the United States each year, according to Nationwide Children’s Hospital and the American Academy of Pediatrics. The head and neck are most prone to injuries due to falls from bunk beds.

With cabin camping right around the corner, our Scouting family is not immune to this risk.

Here are some tips to reduce the risk:

- Use guard rails on both sides of the top bunk.
- Verify that the foundation of the mattress is strong and that the mattress is the correct size.
- Teach children how to safely climb the ladder.
- Roughhousing, bouncing, or playing on the top bunk or ladder is inappropriate.
- Ladders need to be securely fastened to the bunk beds.
- Store objects such as belts, scarves, neckerchiefs, or ropes away from the bed.
- Take the bunk out of service if the ladder or beds are broken, damaged, or missing.

MUSEUM FUN FACT

Order of the Arrow in Northwest Ohio for 65 Years

In 1957, members of the Eagle Creek Lodge of what is now the Black Swamp Area Council came to the Toledo Area Council to form a new Lodge for the Scouts of Northwest Ohio. The Lodge was named Wa-Be-Wa-Wa which translates to “goose in flight” in the Ottawa Native American language.

This name was chosen because of Camp Miakonda’s mascot at the time. Jake the Goose was a friendly goose that could be seen following Ranger Don Fanning around the property as he maintained the camp. In 1973, the name was changed to Tindeuchen which translates to “Fire Builder” in the Lenni Lenape (Delaware) language. Tindeuchen Lodge #522 continues to serve Erie Shore Council.
